

# ***AUTO REPAIR REFERENCE CENTER***

*Auto Repair Reference Center* is a database provided through the **POWER Library** which contains information on repairing many different makes and models of vehicles built between 1954 and the present. The database includes repair procedures, service bulletins and recalls, wiring diagrams and a calculator to estimate how much procedures will cost at a service station.

## ***HOW TO READ CARE AND REPAIR TIPS***

- To read through a wealth of general car repair advice, including buying advice, descriptions of various parts and systems, fuel efficiency tips, a glossary of terms and more, **click** on the small **Care & Repair Tips** tab near the top right of the screen. This can be accessed at any time, and it will open a new window so you can look at tips without losing your place in the database.

## ***HOW TO FIND INFORMATION ON YOUR VEHICLE***

- On each screen, you need to select the option most appropriate for your need. In most cases you must first **click** on the **year** of your car, then **click** on its **make** and finally **click** on its **model**. You might be asked for additional information to distinguish between different variations of a particular model.
- Once you have found the page for your vehicle, **click** on the **Topic** that interests you.
- **Topic: Labor** will allow you to estimate the expense of paying someone else to work on your vehicle.
- If a **Topic** is printed in gray text, it means that no information in that category is available for the vehicle that you have chosen.

## ***HOW TO VIEW OR PRINT RESULTS***

- Most of the documents in this database are stored in **Adobe Acrobat (PDF)** format. If a document fails to display after you **click** on it, you may need to download and install the free **Adobe Acrobat Reader** program. Instructions for doing this can be found at [www.adobe.com/reader/](http://www.adobe.com/reader/).
- To **print** a document while you are viewing it, **click** on the **printer button** (a small button showing a picture of a printer) within the **Adobe Acrobat Reader**. A dialog box will pop up where you can specify which printer to use, how many copies to make and which pages to print. If all of the options are correct, **click** the **OK** button.
