

FACTS ON FILE: TODAY'S SCIENCE

Today's Science, written especially for students, explains important developments in biology, chemistry, the environment, space, physics and technology. Find images, charts, graphs, an encyclopedia, glossary, science fair guide, and help doing research papers and experiments. Help for teachers.

Find It

Go to www.ccls.org>Databases (left side)>F> Facts on File>Today's Science.

Browse It

Browse Science in the Headlines. Read the feature article. Scan the Subject Index and the Hot Topics. See the Special Features.

Search It

Use the **Keyword Search** box on the upper left of the website. **Use quotation marks around phrases and proper names.** You can search the **story and title** or **title text only**, using keywords or a specific phrase, and specify **date ranges** for results, from any page. Use AND, OR, or NOT to refine your search.

To search other **Facts on File** databases at the same time, click **Advanced Search**. For Help, click (?) on the upper right.

Display It

Sort results by relevance or date. Use tabs to sort results by Featured Articles, Science Encyclopedia or Images. Download **Browsealoud** software in the FAQs section to **hear text you select** from Today's Science or to **record selections as MP3 files**.

Save It

You can save articles from one session in a guest folder. To keep the folder for later sessions, sign up with the site.

Take It

The articles have persistent links so that you can find them later.

To e-mail from an article's page, click the envelope icon on the upper right. Separate multiple addresses with a semicolon (;). E-mailed versions of articles include citation information. **They do not include images.** Add the e-mail address **Requests@Facts.com** to your "safe sender" list to ensure that the article reaches your inbox.

To print from an article's page, select the printer icon on the upper right. A printer-friendly version of the article will appear **including images**. Use your browser's **Print** function to print the article with its citation.

Cite It

MLA or APA formats are given.
